The Texas A&M University System (TAMUS) National Laboratories Office (NLO)'s mission is to facilitate a network of engagement between U.S. National Laboratories and TAMUS universities and agencies to create impactful contributions to national security, scientific discovery, and applied technology.

Our work creates opportunies for TAMUS researchers, faculty and students to engage with the Department of Energy's (DOE) National Nuclear Security Administration (NNSA) and their national labs.

Direct DOE investments across the TAMUS inlcude \$148.7 Million in research across 232 programs. Over \$50 Million into currently active Research and Development (R&D) and other programs due to NLO efforts.



36 active projects or programs being funded across **43 departments** and institutes led by over **33 TAMUS faculty and staff** due directly to NLO efforts.



Over 50 engagement OPPORTUNITIES sponsored by the NLO to help connect graduates

and students of the TAMUS with our National Labs over the last 5 years including nearly 20 recruitment and hiring events.
